- Breath and depth has been expanded to include all Healthcare Acquired Infections
- Hand Hygiene is an essential component of HAI prevention and Statewide initiative will be supported by the Learning Network

- PULSE (Virtual Community)
- Tools & Resources
- SHEA Change Package - Evidence-based addresses key organizational drivers for HAI prevention including **Hand Hygiene**.

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Maryland Hand Hygiene Collaborative Aim

All Hand Hygiene Collaborative Participants Will Achieve a Hand Hygiene Compliance Rate of at Least 90% for All Units/Participants.



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Components of the Hand Hygiene Collaborative

Mandatory Components:

- Train observers/"secret shoppers"
- Participate in data collection and reporting according to timeline
- **Attend expert-led face to face Learning Sessions in February and April**
